- The **Nrityamandap (Natya Mandap)** of the temple becomes a centre for these performances, reviving the **ancient tradition of music and dance in temples**.
- The festival highlights **devotion, cultural heritage, artistic expression, and community participation**, making it one of the **major celebrations of Gujarat**.

2. Rann Utsav

- **Rann Utsav** is a **unique cultural and tourism festival** celebrated in the **Kutch region of Gujarat**, showcasing the **rich heritage, art, music, dance, and traditions** of the area.
- It is held during the **winter months (November to February)** when the **Great Rann of Kutch (White Desert)** turns into a **stunning moonlit landscape**.

- Visitors enjoy **folk music and dance performances** in the **open desert under moonlight**, showcasing the **cultural vibrancy of Gujarat**.
- Activities include **camel safaris, cultural shows, handicraft exhibitions, local tours, and traditional cuisine**, giving a complete cultural experience.

- The idea of Rann Utsav was **envisioned by Prime Minister Narendra Modi** (during his tenure as Gujarat's Chief Minister).

3. International Kite Festival

- The **International Kite Festival** is one of the **most famous events of Uttarayan**, held every year in **Ahmedabad, Gujarat** around **14th January (Makar Sankranti)**.

5. Vibrant Navratri Festival

- During these nine nights, people from **villages and cities** gather in open spaces to celebrate **Shakti (feminine divine power)**, showing deep **faith and cultural pride**.
- The main attraction of Navratri is the **Garba and Dandiya Raas dances**. Garba is performed in circles, while **Dandiya** involves dancing with **small wooden sticks**. These dance forms are connected to **stories of Lord Krishna and the Gopis**, expressing **love and emotions through music and movement**.
- At the center of every Garba circle is a small **shrine of the Goddess**, set up at the beginning of the festival. It includes a **garbo (earthen pot)** filled with items like a **coconut, betel nut, and coin**, symbolizing **life and positivity**.
- Each night begins with a **puja (prayer)** dedicated to different forms of the Goddess. The nine days are divided into three parts:
 - First three days for **Durga** (power and protection)
 - Next three for **Lakshmi** (wealth and prosperity)
 - Last three for **Saraswati** (knowledge and art)
- Navratri is also linked to **fertility and harvest**, where people sow grains in soil as a symbol of **growth and new beginnings**.
- After the prayers, the atmosphere becomes lively with **music and dancing**. People dance in circles for hours, often till late night, enjoying the **rhythm and festive spirit**.
- The **dance steps are simple**, but over time many **creative and modern styles** have been added. Music has also evolved from **traditional drums and singing** to **modern sound systems and live bands**.
- On the **tenth day, Dussehra (Vijayadashami)** is celebrated. People perform **puja for their vehicles**, buy new things, and enjoy special foods like **fafda and jalebi**.
- Beyond rituals, Navratri is a time of **joy, freedom, and togetherness**. Many people follow **fasting or simple diets**, and women especially enjoy stepping out, dancing freely, and feeling a **strong spiritual connection**.
- The circular Garba dance represents the **cycle of life and divine energy**, where everyone moves together around the center, creating a feeling of **unity, devotion, and inner happiness**.

6. Megh Malhar Parv Saputara
