1-7 August	World Breastfeeding Week	Supported by WHO and UNICEF to promote breastfeeding as one of the most effective ways to improve child health and survival.
2 August	Friendship Day	Celebrated on the first Sunday of August in India to honour friendship, mutual trust and lifelong relationships.
2 August	World Anglo Indian Day	Recognises the history, heritage and contribution of the Anglo Indian community.
6 August	Hiroshima Day	Observed to remember the victims of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and spread awareness about peace and nuclear disarmament.
6 August	International Day of Awareness of the Special Development Needs and Challenges of Landlocked Developing Countries	Highlights the development challenges faced by landlocked developing nations and encourages international cooperation.
7 August	National Handloom Day	Commemorates the beginning of the Swadeshi Movement in 1905 and recognises India's handloom weavers and textile heritage.
8 August	Quit India Movement Day	Marks the launch of the Quit India Movement by Mahatma Gandhi in 1942 against British rule.
8 August	International Cat Day	Celebrates the welfare and protection of cats while promoting responsible pet care.
9 August	Nagasaki Day	Remembers the victims of the atomic bombing of Nagasaki and reinforces the message of global peace.
9 August	International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples	Recognises the rights, cultures and traditions of indigenous communities across the world.

10 August	World Biofuel Day	Promotes the importance of biofuels as cleaner and sustainable alternatives to conventional fuels.
11 August	World Steelpan Day	Celebrates the cultural importance of the steelpan musical instrument.
12 August	International Youth Day	Encourages youth participation in social, economic and sustainable development.
12 August	World Elephant Day	Raises awareness about elephant conservation and habitat protection.
13 August	International Left Handers Day	Celebrates left handed individuals and spreads awareness about their uniqueness.
13 August	World Organ Donation Day	Encourages organ donation to save lives and spread awareness about transplantation.
15 August	Independence Day	Celebrates India's independence from British rule on 15 August 1947 and honours the sacrifices of freedom fighters.
16-28 August	Onam	Festival of Kerala and a major harvest festival celebrating the annual homecoming of King Mahabali.
16 August	Parsi New Year	Marks the beginning of the New Year for the Parsi community.
17 August	Naag Panchami	Hindu festival dedicated to the worship of snakes and seeking protection and prosperity.
19 August	World Photography Day	Celebrates photography as a medium for creativity, communication and historical documentation.
19 August	World Humanitarian Day	Honours humanitarian workers who provide assistance during conflicts and disasters worldwide.

20 August	World Mosquito Day	Spreads awareness about mosquito borne diseases and disease prevention.
20 August	Sadbhavna Diwas	Observed on the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi to promote national unity and harmony.
20 August	Indian Akshay Urja Day	Promotes renewable energy sources such as solar, wind and hydropower in India.
21 August	World Senior Citizen Day	Recognises the contribution of senior citizens and highlights their welfare.
21 August	World Entrepreneurs' Day	Celebrates entrepreneurship, innovation and business leadership.
21 August	International Day of Remembrance and Tribute to the Victims of Terrorism	Pays tribute to victims and survivors of terrorist attacks.
22 August	Madras Day	Celebrates the foundation and history of the city of Chennai.
22 August	International Day Commemorating the Victims of Acts of Violence Based on Religion or Belief	Promotes religious freedom, tolerance and respect for all communities.
23 August	International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and Its Abolition	UNESCO observance remembering the history of the slave trade and its abolition.
26 August	Women's Equality Day	Highlights equal rights and opportunities for women empowerment .
27 August	World Lake Day	Raises awareness about protecting lakes from pollution, overuse and climate change.
28 August	Raksha Bandhan	Celebrates the bond between brothers and sisters through the tradition of tying a sacred thread.

28 August	World Sanskrit Day	Promotes Sanskrit language, literature and India's classical knowledge tradition.
29 August	Telugu Language Day	Celebrates the Telugu language and its literary heritage.
29 August	National Sports Day	Marks the birth anniversary of hockey legend Major Dhyan Chand and promotes sports and fitness.
29 August	International Day against Nuclear Tests	Raises awareness about the harmful effects of nuclear weapon testing and supports a nuclear weapon free world.
30 August	International Day of the Victims of Enforced Disappearances	Raises awareness about enforced disappearances and human rights protection.
30 August	National Small Industry Day	Recognises the contribution of small scale industries to India's economy.
31 August	International Day for People of African Descent	Celebrates the culture, heritage and contributions of people of African descent.

Important Days in August 2026 Explained

These important observances represent India's historical legacy, cultural diversity, environmental conservation, health awareness, humanitarian values and international cooperation.

1-7 August- World Breastfeeding Week

World Breastfeeding Week is supported by **WHO**, UNICEF and health ministries worldwide. It promotes breastfeeding as one of the most effective ways to improve child health and survival while encouraging supportive policies and workplaces for mothers.

7 August- National Handloom Day

National Handloom Day commemorates the beginning of the **Swadeshi Movement in 1905**. It recognises the contribution of India's handloom weavers and highlights the economic, cultural and traditional importance of the country's handloom industry.

8 August- Quit India Movement Day

Quit India Movement Day marks **Mahatma Gandhi's** launch of the **Quit India Movement** on 8 August 1942. The movement became one of the strongest phases of **India's Freedom Struggle** against British colonial rule.

12 August- International Youth Day

International Youth Day recognises the important role of young people in building inclusive societies. It encourages youth participation in education, innovation, leadership and **sustainable development** across the world.

15 August- Independence Day

India celebrates Independence Day on 15 August every year to commemorate its freedom from **British Rule** in 1947. The **national flag** is hoisted at the **Red Fort** and the sacrifices of **Freedom Fighters** are remembered across the country.

19 August- World Humanitarian Day

World Humanitarian Day honours humanitarian workers who risk their lives during conflicts and disasters to help affected communities. The observance also highlights the growing challenges faced by aid workers worldwide.

20 August- Sadbhavna Diwas

Sadbhavna Diwas is observed on the birth anniversary of former **Prime Minister** of India **Rajiv Gandhi**. The day promotes national integration, communal harmony, peace and mutual understanding among people.

20 August- Indian Akshay Urja Day

Indian Akshay Urja Day creates awareness about renewable energy sources, including **Solar Energy**, **Wind Energy** and **Hydropower**. It encourages sustainable energy development and reduces dependence on conventional fuels.

27 August- World Lake Day

World Lake Day highlights the ecological and economic importance of **Lakes in the World** as sources of freshwater, biodiversity, **flood** control and climate regulation. The observance also raises awareness about **Pollution**, Overuse and **Climate Change** affecting lakes.

28 August- Raksha Bandhan

Raksha Bandhan celebrates the strong bond between brothers and sisters. It is a major **Festival of India** in which sisters tie a sacred thread called Rakhi on their brothers' wrists, while brothers promise lifelong care and protection.

29 August- National Sports Day

National Sports Day is celebrated on the birth anniversary of hockey legend **Major Dhyan Chand**. The day promotes sports culture, physical fitness and the importance of an active lifestyle.

29 August- International Day against Nuclear Tests

Observed by the **United Nations**, this day spreads awareness about the devastating effects of nuclear weapon testing. It encourages global efforts to eliminate nuclear tests and supports international peace and security.

30 August- National Small Industry Day

National Small Industry Day recognises the role of **Small Scale Industries** in generating employment, promoting entrepreneurship and strengthening India's economic development.

30 August- International Day of the Victims of Enforced Disappearances

This international observance highlights the issue of enforced disappearances and stresses the importance of protecting **human rights**, justice and accountability.

31 August- International Day for People of African Descent

This day recognises the achievements, heritage and cultural contributions of people of African descent while promoting equality, dignity and inclusion across societies.

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
