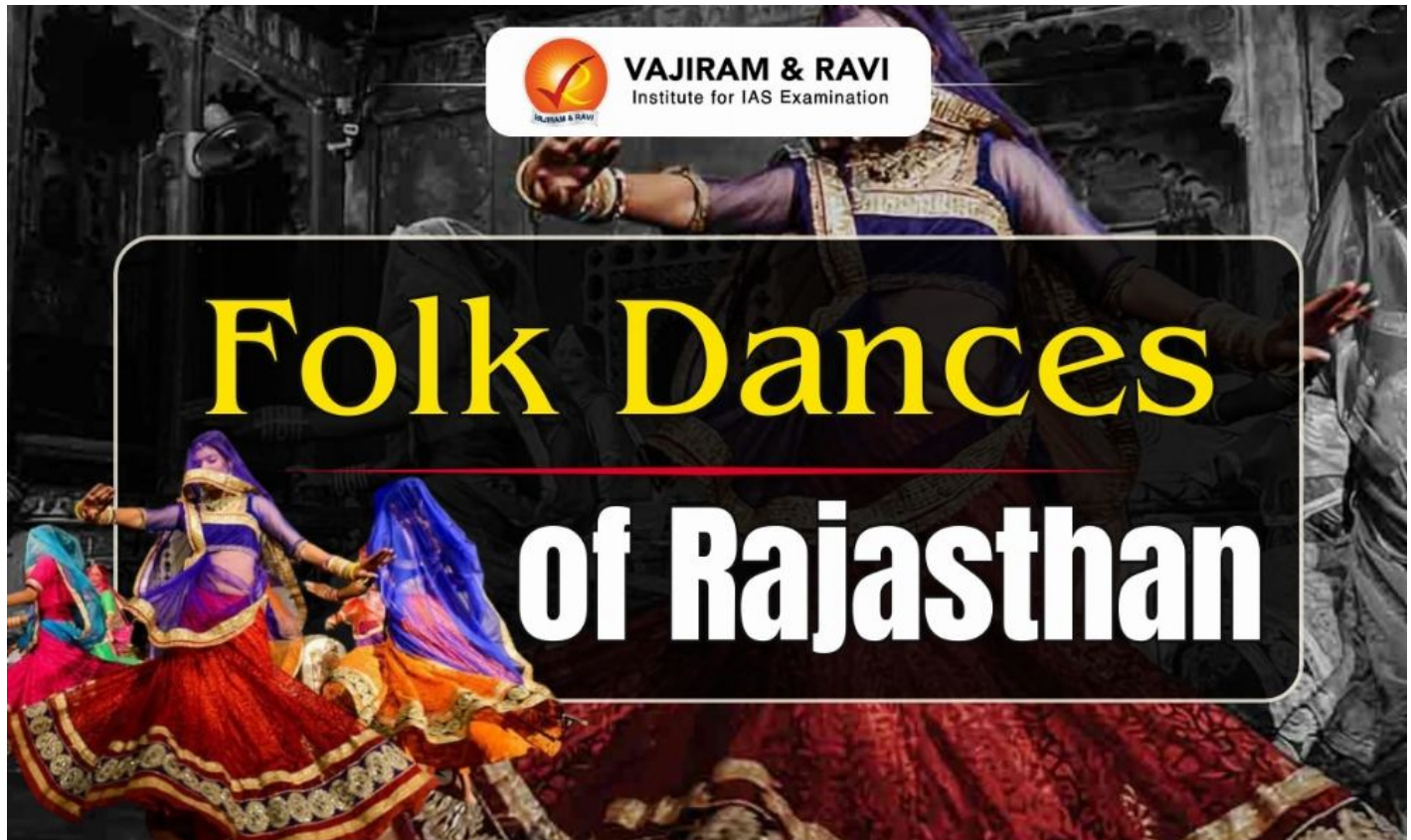


Folk Dances of Rajasthan, List, Features, and Cultural Significance

5. Kathputli Dance

6. Chari Dance
