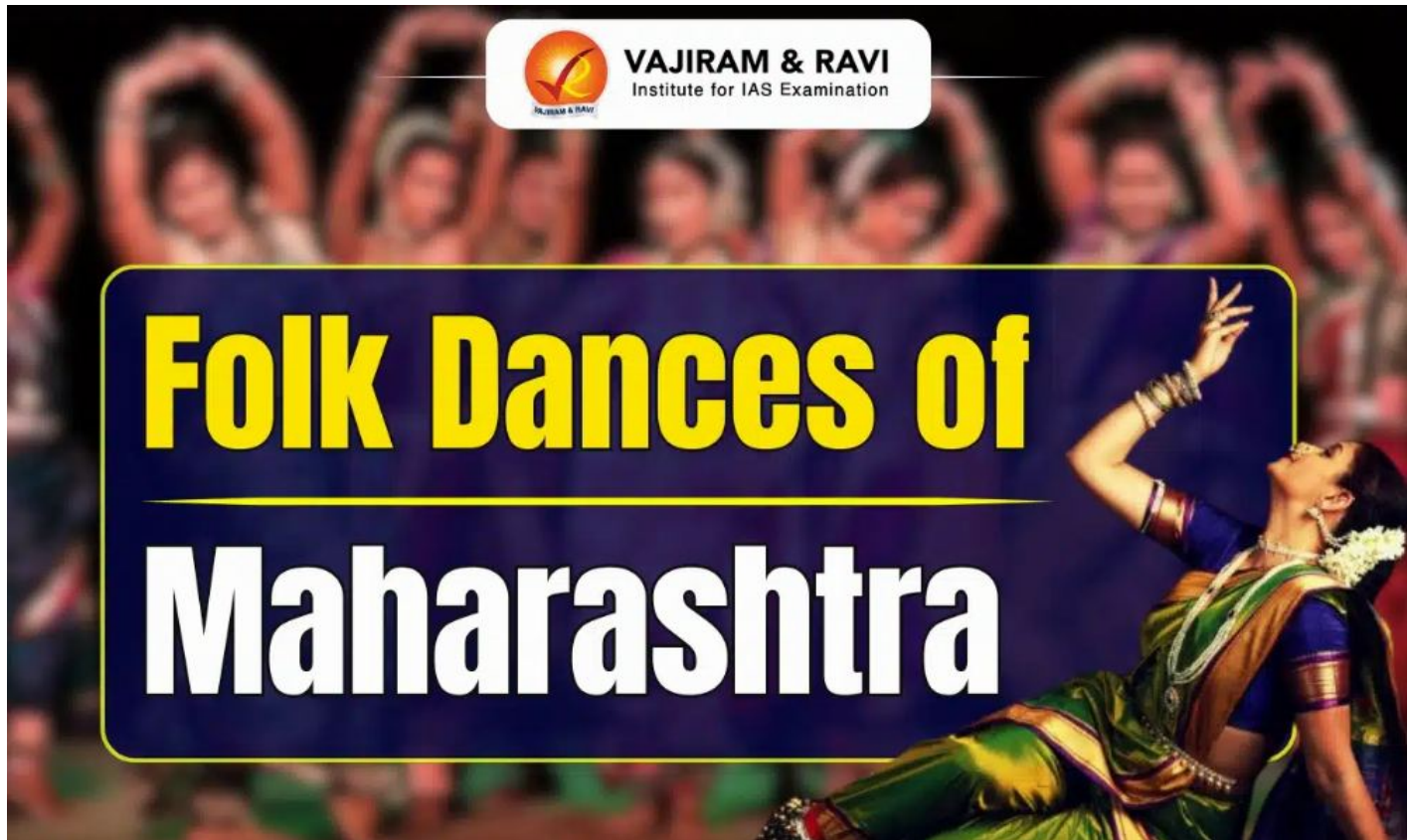


Folk Dances of Maharashtra, Name, List, Features, Cultural Significance
