- **Massive Destruction:** The explosion destroyed large parts of the city, including **homes, industries, schools, and hospitals**.
- **Human Loss:** Around **40,000-75,000 people** died immediately, while the death toll rose to approximately **70,000-80,000** by the end of **1945** due to injuries and radiation exposure.
- **End of World War II:** The bombing, along with the **Hiroshima bombing**, contributed to **Japan's surrender on August 15, 1945**, bringing **World War II** to an end.
- **Annual Observance:** Since **1946**, **Nagasaki Day** has been observed every **August 9** to honor the victims and promote **world peace, nuclear disarmament**, and the prevention of future nuclear conflicts.

Impact of the Nagasaki Bombing

- **End of World War II:** The bombing accelerated **Japan's surrender on August 15, 1945**, bringing **World War II** to a close.
- **Global Awareness:** The tragedy strengthened international efforts toward **nuclear disarmament, arms control**, and the promotion of **global peace**.

Differences Between Hiroshima and Nagasaki Bombings

The **Hiroshima** and **Nagasaki** bombings were the only two uses of **atomic weapons in warfare**. While both occurred during the final days of **World War II**, they differed in terms of the **type of bomb, target selection, geography, casualties, and extent of destruction**.

Global Efforts Toward Nuclear Disarmament

Global efforts toward nuclear disarmament aim to reduce and ultimately eliminate **nuclear weapons** through international treaties, diplomatic negotiations, and cooperation to ensure **global peace** and **collective security**.

- **Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT)**: Entered into force in **1970** to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons, promote peaceful uses of nuclear energy, and advance nuclear disarmament.

- **International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA):** Monitors the peaceful use of **nuclear technology** and verifies that civilian nuclear programs are not diverted for military purposes.
- **Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT):** Prohibits all **nuclear test explosions**. Although not yet in force, it has significantly reduced nuclear testing worldwide.
- **Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW):** Adopted by the **United Nations** in **2017** and entered into force in **2021**, it is the first legally binding treaty to comprehensively prohibit nuclear weapons.
- **Strategic Arms Reduction Treaties (START/New START):** Agreements between the **United States** and **Russia** to limit and reduce deployed strategic nuclear warheads and delivery systems.
- **United Nations Initiatives:** The **UN General Assembly** regularly adopts resolutions supporting **nuclear disarmament**, non-proliferation, and international security.
- **Role of Hibakusha:** Survivors of the **Hiroshima** and **Nagasaki** bombings, known as **Hibakusha**, continue to advocate globally for a world free of nuclear weapons by sharing their experiences.
