India-ASEAN Relations

- India joined the **ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF)** in **1996**, marking its growing role in **regional security and strategic discussions**.
- From **2002**, **annual ASEAN-India Summits** began, improving high-level engagement and boosting collaboration across sectors.
- In **2004**, both sides adopted a roadmap for cooperation at the summit in Vientiane, focusing on peace, progress, and shared prosperity.
- Economic ties strengthened with the **ASEAN-India Free Trade Area (2009)**, followed by agreements on **services and investment in 2015**, expanding economic integration.
- In **2012**, the relationship was elevated to a **Strategic Partnership**, and further deepened with India's **Act East Policy (2014)** focusing on connectivity and defence cooperation.
- The **2018 Delhi Summit** marked 25 years of relations, while in **2022**, ties were upgraded to a **Comprehensive Strategic Partnership**, covering new areas like **digital economy, maritime security, and emerging technologies**.
- Regular interactions such as the **ASEAN-India Summit** and **Senior Officials' Meetings (SOM)** help in maintaining close cooperation.
- Key areas of collaboration include:
 - **Trade and Economy:** ASEAN is one of India's largest trading partners, with growing investments and business opportunities.
 - **Digital and Technological Cooperation:** Joint initiatives like the ASEAN-India digital work plan promote innovation and connectivity.
 - **Maritime Security:** Both work together to ensure safety and stability in the Indo-Pacific, especially in crucial sea routes.
 - **Cultural and People-to-People Ties:** Shared historical and cultural links strengthen mutual understanding.

- ASEAN plays a central role in India's Indo-Pacific vision by supporting a **free, open, and rules-based regional order**, which is essential for global peace and economic growth.

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
