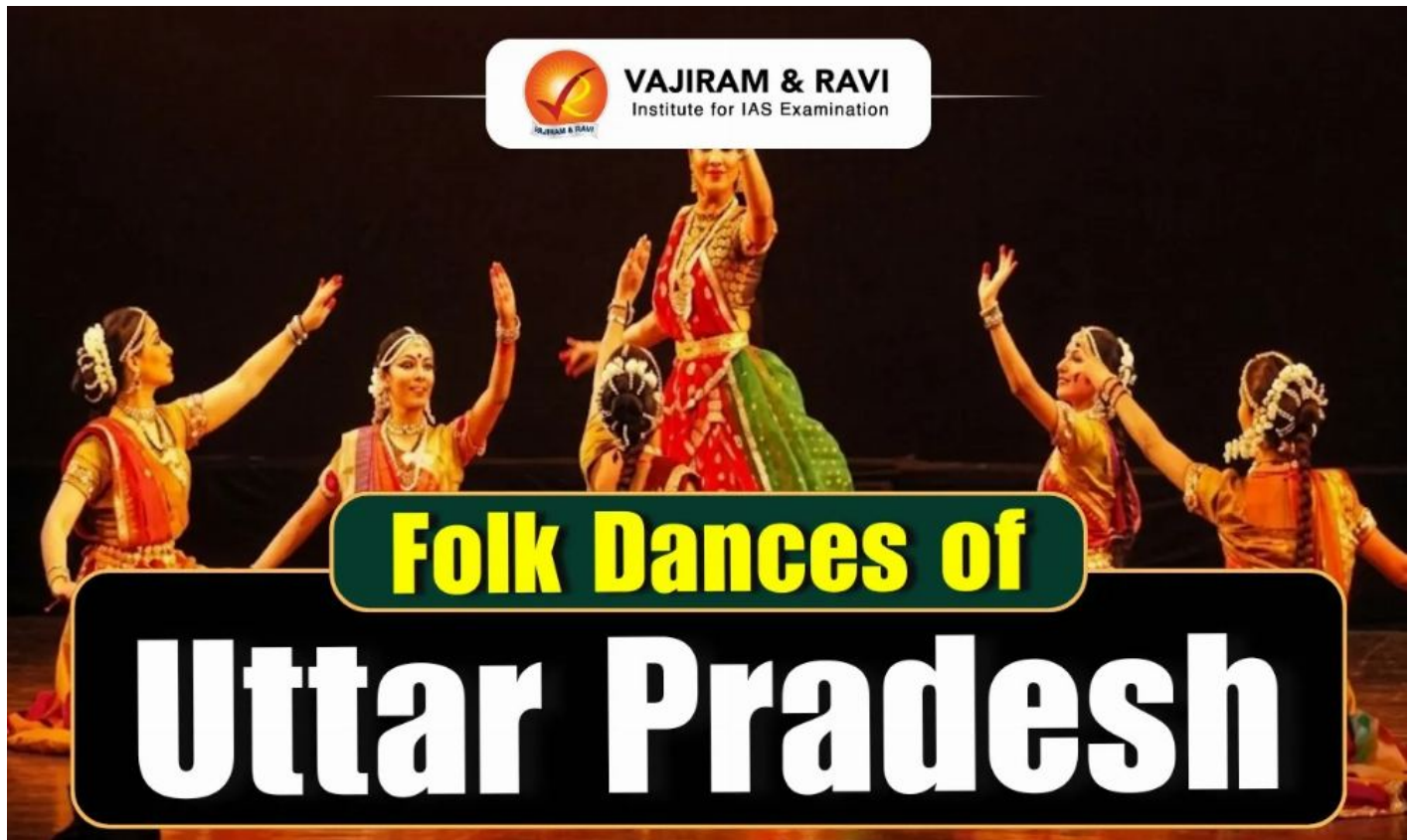


Folk Dances of Uttar Pradesh, List, Types & Significance
