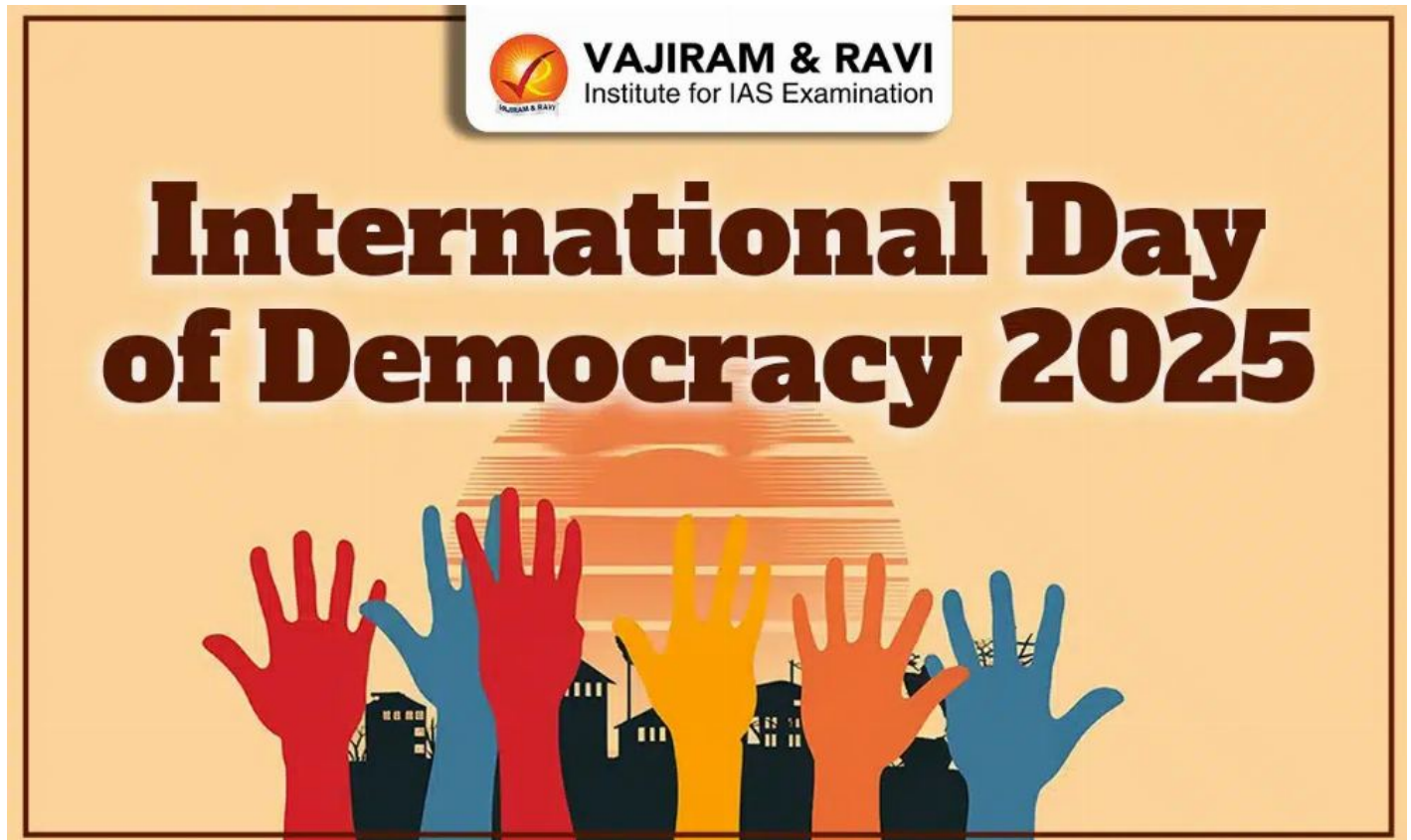


# International Day of Democracy 2025, Theme, History, Importance
