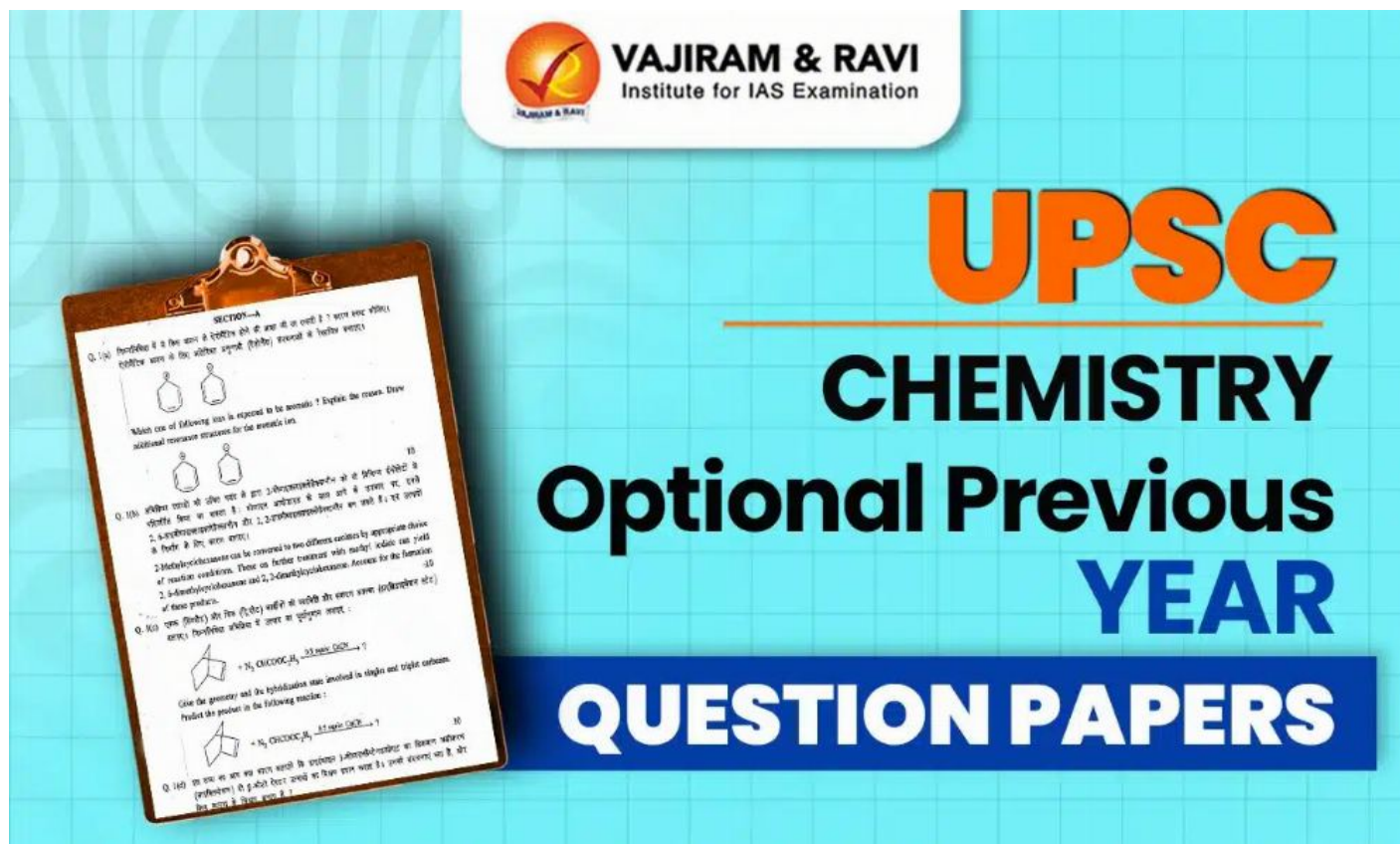

UPSC Chemistry Optional Paper 2025 Syllabus

The syllabus for Chemistry optional covers topics from Physical, Organic, Inorganic, and Applied Chemistry, broadly distributed between Paper I and Paper II.

Paper I - Physical and Inorganic Chemistry

This paper primarily evaluates candidates on their conceptual clarity of fundamental areas, including:

- Atomic Structure and Chemical Bonding
- Solid State Chemistry
- Gaseous and Liquid States
- Thermodynamics and Electrochemistry
- Chemical Kinetics
- Coordination Chemistry
- Bio-inorganic Chemistry

A systematic study of these areas ensures a strong theoretical foundation necessary for descriptive answers.

Paper II - Organic and Applied Chemistry

This paper focuses on the mechanisms and applications of organic reactions, covering:

- Delocalised Covalent Bonding and Aromaticity
- Reaction Mechanisms and Reactive Intermediates
- Substitution, Elimination, and Addition Reactions
- Rearrangements and Pericyclic Reactions
- Organometallic Compounds and Bio-organic Chemistry
- Applied Chemistry and Analytical Techniques

Success Rate of Chemistry as an Optional Subject

Chemistry has historically maintained a success rate of 9- 10%, which is relatively higher compared to many other optional subjects. This consistency makes it a reliable and rewarding choice for aspirants with a strong academic background in science.

- Thus, Chemistry is best suited for aspirants from science or engineering backgrounds, particularly those who can devote sufficient time to mastering both theory and problem-solving.

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
