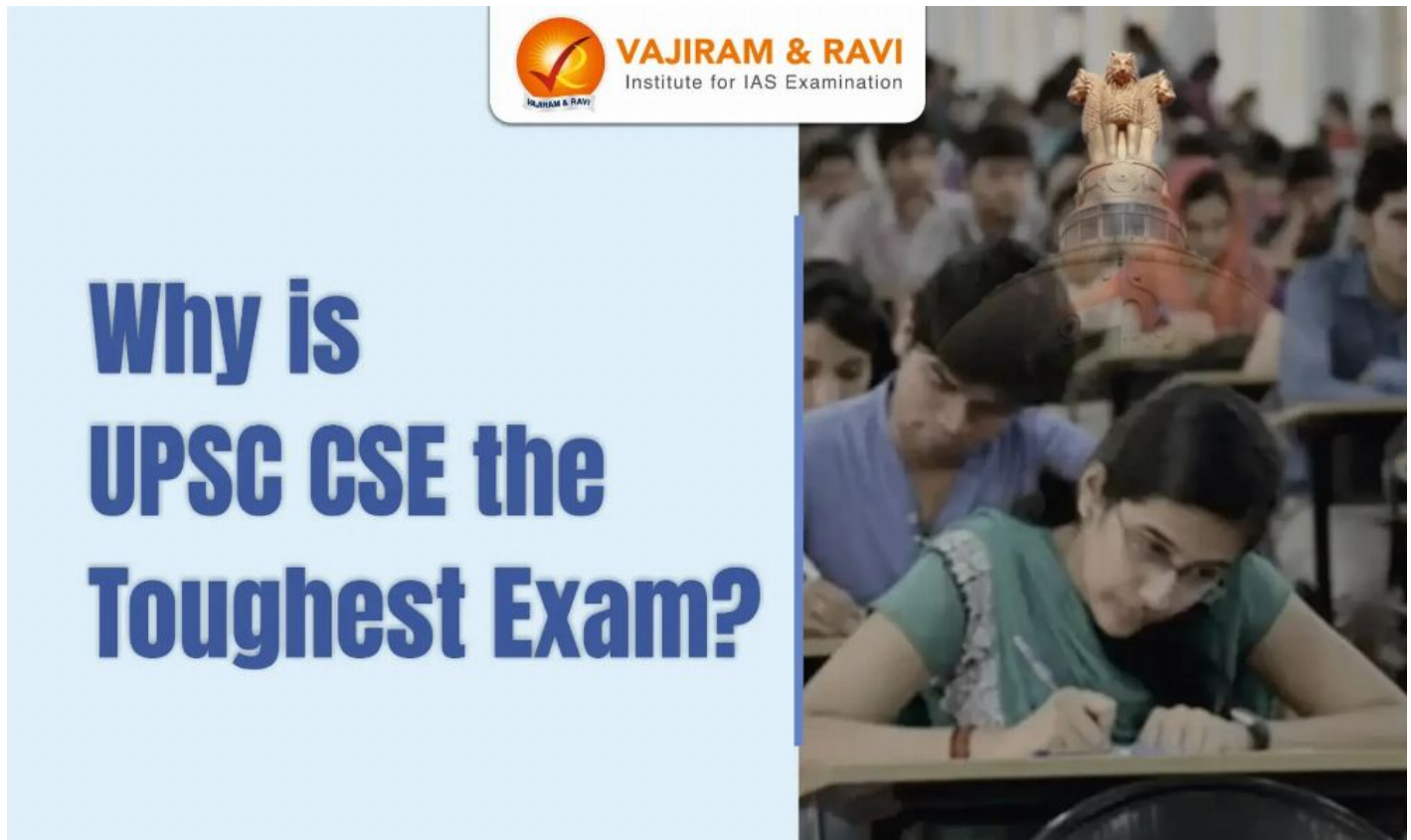


Why is UPSC CSE the Toughest Exam?
