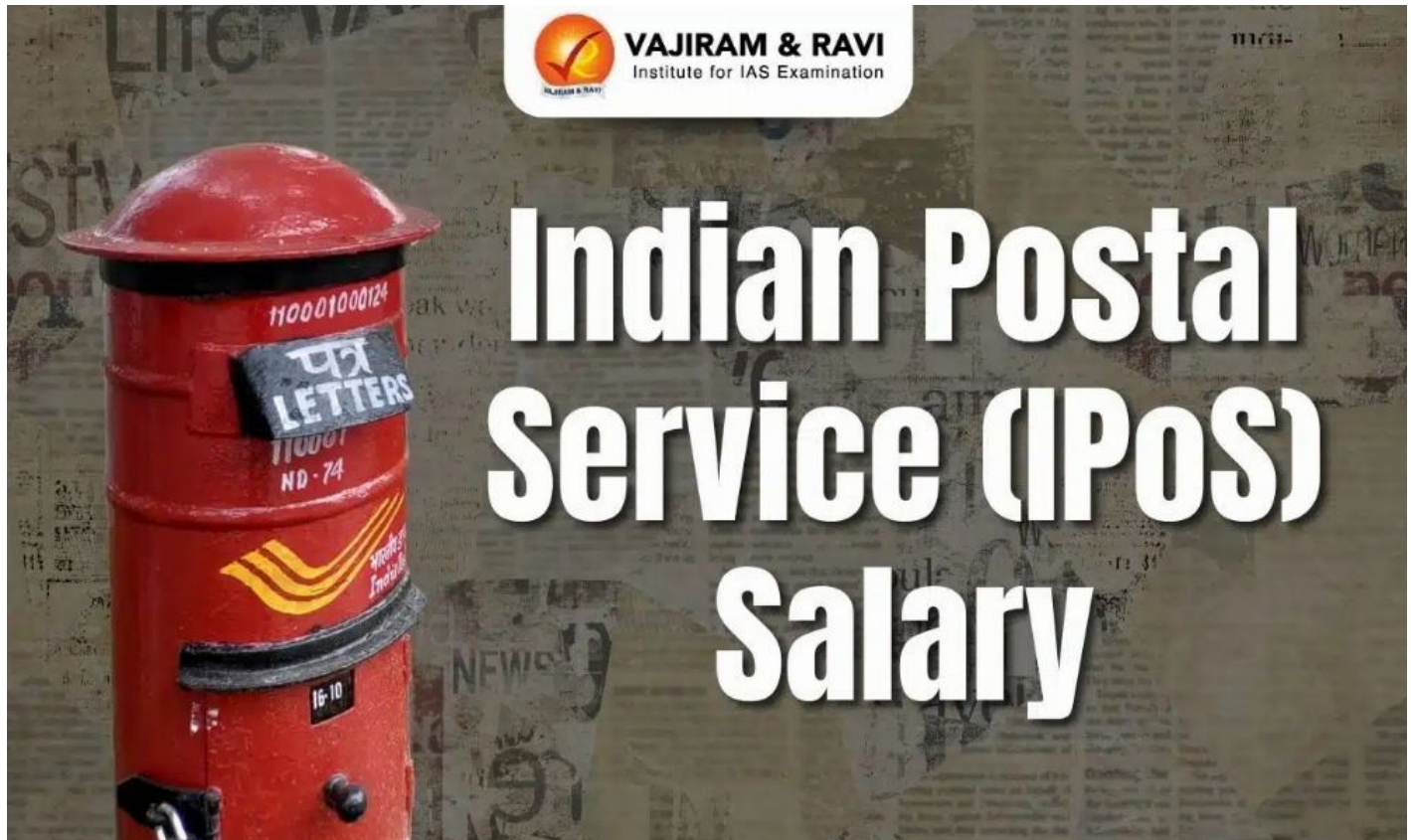


Indian Postal Service (IPoS) Salary, Pay Scale, Eligibility, Job Profile, Allowances

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The Indian Postal Service (IPoS) established in 1948 is a prestigious Group 'A' Civil Service which looks at the functioning of India Post, the world's largest postal network. IPoS Officers are assigned with various responsibilities, including traditional postal services, banking, e-commerce, and social services like pension disbursement and MGNREGA wages. The service is divided into 22 Postal Circles, from which each circle is headed by a Chief Postmaster General.

Indian Postal Service Salary

UPSC CSE 2025 is the exam through which an aspirant can be assigned for the Indian Postal Service. The base job profile for the IPoS is SSRMs or Senior Superintendents of Post Offices (Senior Superintendent of Railway Mail Services) and the Indian Postal Service Salary is determined according to the posts and grades of the employee according to the 7th Pay Commission.

Indian Postal Service Salary Structure

Indian Postal Service Officers begin their service with a pay scale of ₹ 56100. The highest grade in the team is Director-General of Post Offices on the pay scale of Rs.225000. For other grades, salary is the sum of grade pay and pay scale, detailed further in the table below.

Indian Postal Service Salary Perks and Allowance

Indian Postal Service Officers have structured career growth with timely promotions. Each promotion brings an increase in their basic salary, alongside Indian Postal Service Salary Perks and Allowance:

1. **Travel Allowance for Official Duties:** Officers often travel as part of their role, with the government covering all travel costs and providing a dedicated travel allowance.
2. **Housing Provision:** The government provides accommodation in the designated district of service. Officers are expected to reside with their families in these quarters.
3. **Dearness Allowance (DA):** This allowance is to offset the cost of living, adjusting to inflation and maintaining a steady financial balance.
4. **Household Assistance:** Officers are eligible for a domestic helper and security personnel for household support.
5. **Medical Coverage:** Full healthcare benefits are extended to the officer's family throughout their service.
6. **Additional Utilities:** Government provides financial security and stability to retired officers such as Pension and Retirement Benefits.

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
